In the matter of the Memorial Services for the late Francis V. Comfort, of the Washington County Bar.

General Term—May 11, 1954

To the above named Court:

Pursuant to the order of this Court made and entered on April 12th, 1954, we submit the following memorial in honor of the late Francis V. Comfort of the the Washington County Bar.

Francis V. Comfort was born at Mineral Point, Wisconin on August 7, 1853. He came to Stillwater at about the age of 17 and as a young man took up the study of law in the law office of H. R. Murdock. He was admtted to the bar of this state on February 14, 1878.

Copies of various documents relating to his admision to the Bar, including the report of the committee which examianed him and recommending his admission are hereto attached. The originals are on file in the office of the Clerk of this Court, who informs us that there is on file in his office an order dated January 3, 1907, signed by F. M. Crosby, District Judge, which recites that the records of the application of Mr. Comfort by inadvertance or mistake show that he was admitted to practice under the name of Frank V., and which order changes the records to read Francis V.

For more than 47 years thereafter he practiced his profession here in Stillwater. He served as Stillwater City Attorney in 1898 and 1899. He retired from active practice in 1925. During the many years of his active practice he handled many important matters for the people of this community. On October 15, 1883 Mr, Comfort married Miss Elisa T. Hebenstreit. She died in 1923. Three sons, Hollis, Russel and Atwood preceded him in death. Hollis was also a lawyer. He and his father practiced for many years as partners under the firm name of Comfort & Comfort with offices on Myrtle Street in the building west of the Farmers and Merchants State Bank now occupied by Dr. Henry Van Meier. Russel was an investment broker in Chicago. Atwod was killed in France in Wold War I. Surviving Mr. Comfort are two daughters, Helen Manuson of Roberts, Wisconsin and Frances McCord of Chicago, Illinois.

Francis V. Comfort died on April 5th, 1954, having attained the ripe old age of 100 years, 6 months and 26 days. Prior to his death he was probably the oldest member of the Minnesota Bar. He was the contemporary of such pioneer lawyers as Hollis R. Murdock, William McCluer, Fayette Marsh, Frank T. Wilson, James N. Castle, L. E. Thompson, John C. Nethaway, Fred W. Gail, Hugh H. Gillen, Orris E. Lee, C. B. Jack, Thomas Lecky, Jasper N. Searles, L. L. Wanwaring, Edwin D. Buffington, S. Blair McBeath, and George H. Sullivan. Mr. Comfort was buried in Fairview Cemetary, Stillwater, on April 7.

We hereby pay tribute to his memory. He contributed much to the welfare and development of the City of Stillwater and the St. Croix Valley during his lifetime.

We move that this Memorial be filed as a permanent record of this Court and that a certified copy of the same be sent to Mr. Comfort's daughter, Mrs. Helen Magnuson.

COPY OF MINUTES OF A GENERAL TERM OF THE DISTRICT COURT OF THE FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT HELD IN THE COUNTY OF WASHINGTON ON FEBRUARY 14th, 1878, AS APPEARS IN COURT JOURNAL ON PAGE 402

In the Matter of the Application of Levi H. McKusick, Theo. Van Tassel and Frank V. Comfort to be admitted to practice as Attorneys & Counsellors at Law

It appearing from the report of the Committee appointed by the Court to examine such applicants: that said applicants had been severally examined by said committee and found to be citizens of the United States, of the age of twenty one years, of good moral character and possessing the requisite qualifications of learning and ability,

It was thereupon ordered by the Court, that upon taking the oath prescribed by law, said Levi H. McKusick, Theo. Van Tassel and Frank V. Comfort each of them be admitted to practice as attorneys and counsellors at law in all the Courts of the State of Minnesota; thereupon said Levi H. McKusick, Theo. Van Tassel and Frank V. Comfort were severally duly sworn as required by law. Biographical sketches Comfort placed in two books in 1907.

COMPORT, Prancis V., lawyer; born at Mineral Point, Wis., Aug. 7, 1853; son of Amzi W. and Eliza (Vanornum) Comfort; educated in common and high schools, Portage, Wis., and read law with Judge Hollis R. Murdock, at Stillwater, Minn. Learned trade of turner and machinist before 21 years of age; began study of law and also followed civil engineering for two years; was a member of firm of Murdock and Comfort, in insurance business; since 1897 has been alone in the law business. Has been a resident of Stillwater since Aug. 30, 1872, and filled office of city attorney of Stillwater for two years. Republican. Vice president Washington County Bar Association, member Minnesota and American Bar associations. Member Sons of American Revolution. Married at Stillwater, Minn., Sept. 20, 1883, to Miss Elise T. Hebenstreet. Address: Stillwater, Minn.
