**HEARTS THAT BEAT AS ONE.**—So far as the court knows, domestic concord reigns supreme about the hearthstones in Stearns County. An inquiry at the office of Mr. Strong, Clerk of the District Court, revealed the peasant (sic) fact that during the year 1872 but two divorces were granted in this county. One was the case of M. A. Walz *vs.* M. A. Anastasia Walz *alias* M. A. A. Pulaski, in which it appeared that the defendant had various and divers husbands lying around loose in different localities; the other was Ellen M. Horn *vs.* William H. Horn, in which desertion was charged —and this case has since attracted considerable public attention from various developments. In 1873 no divorce has been granted. It is only in St. Paul, Minneapolis and those wicked places that domestic rows take place to cause the sundering of united souls. ■
