Warren Edward Maunsell 1889-1953

Warren Edward Maunsell, court reporter for the 19th Judicial District for more than 37 years, and an attorney at law for 24 years, died suddenly on December 18, 1953 at the of age 64 years.

Warren Maunsell was born on October 18, 1889 at Glencoe, Minnesota, a son of William Howard and Grace Maunsell. When still an infant child, his parents moved to Stillwater. He attended the public schools of Stillwater, Minnesota, and the St. Paul College of Law at St. Paul, Minnesota. He was admitted to the Bar in 1929.

Warren Maunsell was a veteran of World War I and held a commission of Second Lieutenant in that war. In 1936 he was elected Special Judge of the Municipal Court of the City of Stillwater, which position he retained until his death.

Mr. Maunsell had the distinction of serving as Court Reporter under four different District Judges. He was first appointed Court Reporter by Judge J. C. Nethaway on September 23, 1916, and then serve successfully thereafter under Judges J. M. Searles, Alfred P. Stolberg and our present Judge Carl W. Gustafson, until his death.

Warren was an ardent hunter and active in the Rod and Gun Club of Stillwater.

He died, so to speak, "with his boots on". On Friday, December 18th, 1953, he was on the job in Court, apparently in good health and in obvious good spirits. The next day he was dead. We mourn his passing.
